TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF BOOKING:

- Only 20 persons (including tour guides) are permitted in the lighthouse lantern area at any one time. Larger groups can be accommodated but will be split into smaller groups for ascending / descending the tower.
- It is extremely important that your group arrives on time for the sake of other visitors and staff. If you are unavoidably delayed, please ensure you contact the tour coordinator immediately on (01262) 673769.
- The lighthouse you are wishing to visit is fully operational; as such Trinity House's use of the property takes precedence over all other uses. Should the visit need to be cancelled by Trinity House due to an emergency situation, the tour coordinator will endeavour to give you as much notice as possible.
- If you need to cancel your visit for any reason, please contact the tour coordinator.
- Group leaders must take responsibility for their group and supervise them (as appropriate) during the visit.
- Please note that there are no welfare or toilet facilities on site. Toilets are available adjacent to the car park.
- Please note that a £60 minimum charge applies to each out of hour's tour.
- Group visits are allocated a specific time slot to accommodate the booking and numbers within the group. Extensions to the allocated times may be charged accordingly at £60 per hour.

HEALTH AND SAFETY AND RISK ASSESSMENTS:

- Children are very welcome, but they must be at least 1.1 metres in height and physically capable of ascending and descending the staircases by themselves unaided.
- Under no circumstances can children or babies be carried up or down the staircases (this includes the use of baby carriers, papposes etc.).
- In many cases lighthouses are over a century old and some stone floors and stairs may be worn and uneven in places. They are regularly tested to ensure they are non-slip but please take great care.
- Some stair cases are very steep and must be descended facing the stair. The tour guide will inform you if this is necessary.
- Sensible footwear must be worn – open toed sandals (without heel straps), flip flops, high heeled footwear and bare or stocking feet are not permitted.
- Regrettably due to the historic design of the building, these premises are not suitable for some physically less able people.
- Anyone suffering from vertigo, heart or respiratory conditions is advised not to undertake the tour.
- If a visitor has a cardiac pace maker, please ensure the tour guide is informed and that you do not go within two metres of any operational RADAR.
- The tour guides will give further advice on the above Health and Safety guidelines but has absolute discretion in preventing access if it is felt that Health and Safety regulations or the safety of the visitor or other members of the public would be compromised.
- Whilst every effort has been made to protect visitors from unsuspected hazards it is not possible to make any historic property as safe as a modern building. Group Leaders must stress this to their party before the visit and ensure they are closely supervised, (as appropriate) at all times whilst on site.
- Groups are responsible for undertaking their own risk assessments. If you wish to make a preparatory visit, our tour coordinator will advise you of any important points to look out for. Please do not ask our tour co-ordinator or guides to check or sign any section of your risk assessment form as they do not have any responsibility to do so.
